The Second edition of the “Summer School on International and European Food Trade Regulation - Understanding international customs regulations” has been established for the academic year 2021-2022.

1 – Description of the Course

The Summer School is managed by the School of Law – Luiss Guido Carli – located at Viale Pola 12, 00198 - Rome.

The Director of the course is Prof. Enzo Moavero Milanesi. The Scientific Committee is composed of the following professors: Gustavo Ghidini, Peter van den Bossche, Henry Kuiper, Silvio Martuccelli, Christian Mestre, Maria Pia Ragonieri, Michele Tamponi, Attilio Zimatore.

The course aims to provide in-depth knowledge of international, European and regional Regulations governing the import and export of agri-food products. The course programme includes analysis of both general international rules (e.g. tariff calculation and harmonised system, rules of origin, simplification of customs procedures and policies) and those contained in specific agreements designed to ensure a preferential system. Special attention will be paid to the comparative analysis of the systems in force in the United States, Canada, China and ASEAN countries, with the study of concrete cases of import and export of agri-food products from and to these geographical areas.

The Faculty of the course will be made up of experts in international commercial law from leading Italian and European universities, specialized law firms, international organizations and agri-food companies of international scale.

2 – Academic Structure

The Summer School requires a comprehensive academic effort that includes 46 teaching hours and 24 hours to be devoted to the final thesis, which corresponds to 8 ECTS.

Classes will be delivered in a blended formula: both in-person and on-line. In particular, it is envisaged that at least 60% of the teaching hours will be in-person. However, even when lessons will be taught in-person, students can elect to attend classes remotely.

The lectures will take place from 8 to 16 July 2022. Should the health emergency continue, the timetable and the modality of the Summer School is held could change in accordance with the rules in force on that date.

Academic tutors will assist the students throughout their academic activities of the Summer School and respond to their specific learning needs.

Attendance to the Summer School’s activities is mandatory. If students miss more than 20% of the required teaching hours, they will not complete the Summer School and, therefore, will not receive the final title and the ECTS.

Should a student miss teaching hours, fail to submit or pass the final thesis or be responsible of academic and professional misconduct, the Director can decide, at his unquestionable judgement, his/her suspension or exclusion. In both cases, tuition fees will not be returned.

Having completed their mandatory teaching hours, students will work on a final thesis based on a topic selected among those examined during the lectures of the Summer School. The final thesis shall consist of at least 4000 words and will be evaluated by the Professors of the Summer School, supervised by the Director.

3 – Number of participants and academic calendar

The Summer School is limited to 50 participants. The minimum number required to activate the Course is of 10 students.

Classes are normally held as follows:

- Monday to Friday: 2:00 – 8:00 PM.
- Saturdays: 8:30 AM - 1:30 PM.

4 – Admission Criteria

Admission to the Summer School is dependent upon the positive evaluation of the *curriculum vitae et studiorum*.

In order to take part to the admission procedures, the applicant is required to have a Bachelor, or a Master's degree, or an equivalent degree from a foreign university.

Students without one of these titles can take part to the Summer School provided that there are places available in relation to the maximum number of 50 participants. These students will receive a certificate of attendance, but they will not obtain any ECTS credits.

The evaluation of the applications will be carried out at various dates in relation to the order of arrival of the online applications.

The applicant will receive an invitation through an email sent to the address specified in the online admission form.

The admission procedure ends when the maximum number of participants is reached.

Applicants are required to upload the following documents:

1. Copy of an identity document (passport or National ID Card where applicable);
2. Photocopy of university degree with details of exams, grades and academic credits or self-certification as per D.P.R. 445/2000; or academic transcripts if the student has not yet obtained an academic title;
3. Curriculum vitae et studiorum (CV) as per D.P.R. 445/2000;
4. Additional documents to be evaluated for the admission as per D.P.R. 445/2000.

Upon uploading these documents, students receive an email confirming that the application has been successfully submitted.

5 – Selections and Admission

The result of the selection procedure (admission, exclusion, reserve), with the ranking list of those admitted and, if any, the reserve list, will be communicated to the applicant through an e-mail sent to the address specified in the online admission form.

6 – Admission of foreign students or students with a degree by a foreign university

Upon their admission, students with a foreign university degree need to contact the Italian Consulate or Embassy close to their residency in order to comply with the requirements set by the Italian Ministry of Education, University and Research (Ministero dell'Istruzione, Università e Ricerca).

Academic titles of foreign universities need to be legally translated in Italian and accompanied by a Statement of Equivalent Value (Dichiarazione di Valore in loco) issued by the local Italian Consulate or Embassy. The Statement of Equivalent Value should show the full number of school years and certify the official accreditation of the foreign university issuing the academic degree presented with the application.

As an alternative to the Statement of Equivalent Value, in line with the Lisbon Convention, students need to submit all documentation to Luiss that is deemed necessary for evaluating the academic degree presented with the application. These documents may include, inter alia, certificates with exams and credits and, if adopted, diploma supplements.

7 – Enrolment

The tuition fee to be enrolled in the Summer School is set at EUR 1.200. The tuition fee for Luiss graduates is set at EUR 1.000.

Alumni Luiss, also of post-graduate courses, will be awarded a 10% discount.

Public and private organisations/studies/entities that enrol three or more participants at the same time will be given a 20% discount.

It is possible to request accommodation at the Luiss residence. The fee for the Summers School including accommodation is set at EUR 1.600, or at EUR 1.400 for Luiss graduates.

Students are required to pay the tuition fee according to the full instructions received at the time of their admission. Payments can be made by accessing a dedicated page of the Luiss website (Web Self Service) through the following link: <http://www.luiss.it/studenti/web-self-service>
Credentials for accessing this service will be provided to the student by email.

(Enrolment in the Summer School is completed after the receipt of the original enrolment form duly signed and the payment of the tuition fee. It is possible to anticipate the enrolment form via email to the School of Law – Luiss Guido Carli).

The tuition fee is non-refundable unless the Summer School is not activated due to insufficient number of enrolled students; Luiss's administration will reimburse all funds paid until that moment.

Luiss Guido Carli will issue an invoice to the name of the participants for each payment of the tuition fee.

8 – Withdrawal

Admitted students that intend to withdraw from the Summer School should communicate their intention to do so in writing the Director of the Summer School, so that the places will be offered to the candidates in the reserve list.

Admitted students can withdraw from the Summer School only before the official start of the course. Any request for withdrawal after the start date of the course does not exonerate from the payment of the entire amount of the tuition fee.

9 – Awarding of the title

The admission to the Summer School's final evaluation (see Point 2) is subject to the attendance of at least 80% of teaching hours, to the payment of the tuition fee and to the submission of all the necessary documentation required to complete the registration to the Summer School.

The final examination contributes, proportionally, to achieving the 8 ECTS foreseen.

10 – Data Protection in accordance with Article 13 of the Italian Decree No. 196/2003

As mandated by Article 13 of Italian Legislative Decree 30 June 2003 no. 196, personal data provided by candidates will be processed by Luiss Guido Carli - exclusively for the purposes of managing the admission procedures, enrolment, the consequent management of the same relationship and Luiss communication activities, in compliance with the principles of fairness, lawfulness and transparency and protection of confidentiality.

11 – Students' obligations

1. All those enrolled at the University are required to fulfil the educational commitments undertaken at the moment of the enrolment. They are also required to behave in a manner that respects the profitable performance of teaching activities and the regular performance of profit tests, personal integrity, the dignity of others and the integrity of the decorum of the places where teaching and university life in general takes place. The violation of the aforementioned behavioural duties entails the student's disciplinary responsibility without prejudice to any further sanctions provided for by law.
2. Attendance at courses is compulsory, with strict adherence to class schedules.
3. The student is obliged to be available for verification of attendance in accordance with the established modalities.
4. In order to be admitted to the final examination, it is necessary:
 - being in order with the documents to be submitted and the payment of the registration fee;
 - having attended at least 80% of the teaching hours envisaged in the course programme.
